In the last issue I started out by saying, "It is with deep regret that I must advise the members of the passing of one of our Past Presidents". It is with much greater regret that I read the Second Air Division article covering Geoff which was so meager, it was shameful, after all the work Geoff did for the  $2^{\rm nd}$  ADA and have so few lines to remember him by. Walter Mundy expressed the same comments to me and he provided me with some additional information to be included. Geoff, so our members may know, joined the USAAF as a radio operator in 1942 on anti-sub patrol off the East Coast of the US. He joined the Aviation Cadet Program in 1943 and graduated as a Bombardier from Calsbad, New Mexico from the class of 44-2 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant. Geoff flew 35 missions with the 467th Group. He was awarded the Air Medal with six Oak Leaf Clusters. Once again Geoff was recalled and participated in the Korean

War and was discharged in 1953 Geoff was active in the 467<sup>th</sup> and served as Group Vice President to the 2<sup>nd</sup> ADA and was a Director in the 467th Group. Geoff was a major contributor to the Second Air Division Association and served as President from 1994 to 1996 and 2004 to 2005. He was a most enthused supporter of the Memorial Library. He created the  $2^{nd}$  ADA Bequest Program that resulted in multi-Dollars for the Memorial Library. Geoff was truly our Ambassador of Friendship to the Memorial Library and had many English Friends in and around Norwich. I believe that I can speak for all the members and friends of the 467<sup>th</sup> that Geoff will be deeply missed. but definitely remember for his many efforts throughout the years. To Terry and family, I'm sorry to bring this up again as I know your feelings, but I wanted some to know that they missed giving the proper account for such a great person. Please accept the condolences of the 467th members and friends.

## **Jay Shower Honored**

San Diego pilot Jay Shower, LCdr. USN (Ret.), was presented with the FAA Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award on June 29 in recognition of his lifetime achievement as a career pilot in the U.S. Navy and in civil The award was presented by an FAA representative at Shower's hangar at Gillespie Field in El Cajon, Calif. The Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award pilots who have demonstrated recognizes aviation expertise professionalism. skill and maintaining safe operations for 50 or more years. Shower will be added to the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award -Role of Honor located online, at FAASafety.gov. My deep passion for flight was inherited from my father, Col. Albert Joseph Shower, a career pilot and decorated officer in the United States Air Force, said Shower, who has passed the legacy of flying to his son, Brenden Shower, chief flight instructor for a flight training center under the United States Air Force in Tokyo. Born in Honolulu, Hawaii in 1937, Shower has devoted his life to aviation, and has amassed nearly 18,000 hours of flight time in his career.

An active member of Earth-Rounders fellowship, Shower has circumnavigated the globe, crossing the equator on numerous occasions, and crossing the Geodetic North Pole in his single engine Bonanza. He is one of only a handful of aviators to have flown multiple cross-oceanic flights, delivering single engine planes to pilots located in Europe, New Zealand, Australia and

Hawaii, earning himself a reputation as the go-to guy for ferrying single engine aircraft to and from anywhere in the world. In my 30 years of flying, Jay Shower is the most experienced, knowledgeable and impressive pilot I have ever met, said civil aviator, George Shandel, who contacted Shower upon numerous recommendations from fellow pilots in his search for an experienced pilot to ferry Shandel's single engine plane from Honolulu to the U.S. Mainland in 2001. For 12 consecutive years, Shower has flown to the Oshkosh air show in Wisconsin, and is an active member of the Flying Eagles and Quiet Birdmen.

## Blackwell "Blackie" Charles Dunnam

Blackie, 85, passed away Nov. 3, 2007. He is survived by his wife Lois Whiffen Dunnam, daughter Nancy Dunnam Pierce and husband Matthew of Gunnison Colorado; son Curtis Dunnam of Ithaca New York; and two grandchildren, Ariel and Austin Dunnam.

Blackie was born in Paris France to the late Therese and Richard Dunnam on 31 August 1922. A U.S. citizen by birthright, at the age of seven his family relocated to Dayton Ohio. An Army Air Force B-24 lead crew heavy bomber pilot in World War II, Blackie flew a tour of 30 missions over France and Germany. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal, and was honorably discharged with the rank of Captain. He continued on to Purdue University where he met and married Lois Whiffen. He graduated from Purdue with a B.S. Degree in Mechanical Engineering.

Blackie served 31 years in government service, retiring on 1 January 1980 as a former Director of the Fuels and Lubricant Division of the Aero Propulsion Laboratory at Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton Ohio, a research and development facility. During this period he and his family resided in Troy Ohio.

Blackie was a frequent participant of the 467<sup>th</sup> BG functions as well as the 2ADA. He was a great friend and will be missed dearly by all. Our condolences go out to the family and especially his devoted wife, Lois
