

"Pending revision of letter MFO, NY July 1944, AT 210.71 MPGA, subj: 'Fasses and Informal Leaves of 22 heard' duration,' passes and informal leaves not in excess of forty-eight (40) hours are authorized. Signed IME. Such forty-eight (40) hour presse is used in any one day will not be in excess of one and one-half per cost (15) of strongth of the unit or organization concerned and will be issued in contormity with ETCUSA Cir 54, dated 23 March 1944.

2. RESERICTION OF TRIVEL: TIK A-358-X, 20 BD, dated 8 August 1944, is quoted for the information of all concerned, this Command:

"Attention is directed to NTOSA Cir 40, dated 18 April 1944 and letter this Headquarters, "Restriction on Travel," dated 30 April 1944, both of which are still in effect. Civilian police report U.S. personnel swimming and playing on the beaches in coastal area in violation of these directives. Due to the danger of mines in coastal veters and beaches, this practice is prohibited and violators thereof will be subject to severe disciplinary action. Signed NEPER."

- 3. FIVE RECULATION: Base Fire Regulations prohibit the burning of trash of any description outside of incirculars, which must be located at least fifty (50) feet from any building. Unit Communders will see that these instructions are strictly enforced at all times.
- 4. TRACH DISPOSITION: Effective Monday, 14 August 1944, trash dumped in Pit southwest of Firing Butts, will be limited to the north end of the Pit. Signs to direct the dumping of trash will be posted.
